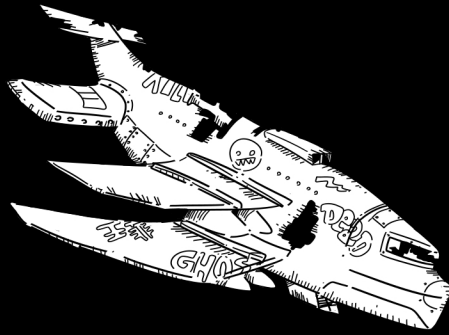

brink of total entropy.

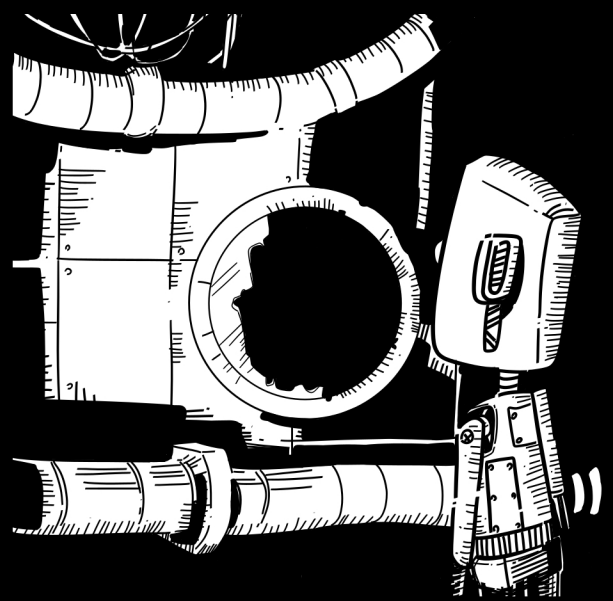
Stars and galaxies had drifted so
